## Sample Voter Ballot

#### PROPOSITION No. 1 - 2024-2025 BUDGET

Shall the Board of Education of the Lyncourt Union Free School District at Salina be authorized to expend the amount of Fifteen Million, Nine Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$15,965,000.00) as a general fund appropriation for the 2024- 2025 school year and to levy the necessary tax therefor upon the taxable property of the District?

**PROPOSITION No. 2 - SALINA FREE LIBRARY PROPOSITION** Shall the annual appropriation for the Salina Free Library within the Lyncourt Union Free School District be increased from the sum of Seventy Four Thousand, Nine Hundred and Twenty Three Dollars (\$74,923.00) annually to the sum of Seventy Six Thousand, Four Hundred and Twenty Two Dollars (\$76,422.00) to be appropriated annually for the Salina Free Library, such sum to be raised by levy of a tax upon the taxable property of the District located in the Town of Salina in accordance with Section 259 of the Education Law?

#### **PROPOSITION No. 3 - INSTRUCTIONAL CONTRACTS**

Shall the Lyncourt Union Free School District be authorized to extend the Instruction Contracts with the East Syracuse Minoa Central School District and Solvay Union Free School District for the school years 2025-2026 through 2028-2029, to continue to allow for the education of eligible Lyncourt students entering grades 9-12, at East Syracuse Minoa High School and Solvay Union Free School District?

#### PROPOSTION No. 4 – 2024 CAPITAL RESERVE FUND

Resolved, the Board of Education of the Lyncourt Union Free School District is hereby authorized to establish a capital reserve fund pursuant to Section 3651 of the Education Law to be designated, "2024 Capital Reserve Fund" created to defray the cost of the construction, reconstruction and equipping of School District buildings, facilities, and land, including original equipment, machinery, apparatus, appurtenances, furnishings, land acquisitions, and other incidental improvements and expenses in connection therewith, and in order to accomplish the same, the Board is hereby authorized to establish the ultimate amount of such reserve fund to Seven Million Dollars (\$7,000,000) inclusive of accrued interest and other investment earnings, with a probable term of ten (10) years. The Board of Education is hereby authorized to pay funds from the available fund balance, state aid reimbursement to the School District on account of capital projects, such other monies as the voters may direct, and/or other legally available funds of the School District to such reserve fund in an amount determined by the Board of Education up to the maximum authorized amount.

#### MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION-VOTE FOR A MAXIMUM OF TWO:

The two candidate receiving the highest number of votes will serve a 3-year term as a Member to the Board of Education.

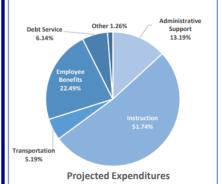

**Three-Part Budget** - All public schools in New York State are required by law to report their spending in three categories: Administrative, Program and Capital.

Administrative: includes expenses for Board of Education, central administration, finance and legal services, public information, personnel, some facilities operations, central services, special items, and supervision of regular school employee benefits.

**<u>Program</u>**: includes expenses for curriculum development, instructional programs, supplies, district information, athletic programs, most employee benefits and charter schools.

**<u>Capital</u>**: includes most expenses for facilitates operations, all maintenance, debt service principal and interest on all building projects.

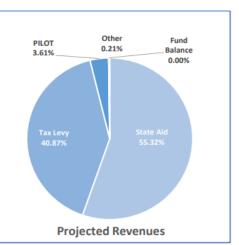

# VOTER QUALIFICATIONS—WHO CAN VOTE?

If you meet the following New York State requirements you are eligible to vote:

- You are a citizen of the United States. •
- You are at least eighteen (18) years of age.
- You are a resident of the school district for at least thirty (30) days prior to May 21, 2024. •

# \*\*You can vote if you rent and live in the Lyncourt School District.

# ABSENTEE BALLOTS and EARLY MAIL BALLOTS

Individuals interested in obtaining an absentee ballot for the upcoming school budget vote on May 21, 2024, may do so at the District Office during business hours, 8:00 a.m.- 4:00 p.m Monday-Friday. Qualified district voters must request in advance an application for an absentee ballot. The voter must complete the application and state the reason he/she will not be able to appear the day of the election. Requirements in order to obtain an absentee ballot are those involving an illness or physical disability, business responsibilities which require travel on the day of the vote, vacation, or students away at college.

Completed applications for absentee ballots must be received by the District Clerk no later than 5:00 P.M. on May 14, 2024, if the absentee ballot is to be mailed to the voter. Completed applications received after May 14, 2024 will require the voter to personally appear at the District Clerk's office by 5/20/2024 at 5:00 p.m. Completed absentee ballots must be received by 5:00 P.M. on May 21, 2024.

Applications for early mail ballots may be applied for at the office of the clerk of the district. A list of all persons to whom early mail ballots shall have been issued, will be available in the said office of the clerk on each of the five days prior to the day of the election except Sundays, and that such list will also be posted at the polling place or places.
