Dear Lyncourt School Community,

As we continue to focus on open and effective communication with community members, we have developed a COVID-19 Dashboard to help keep you informed.

The COVID-19 Dashboard can be found on the main page of our website and will be updated daily as we receive testing results and complete the contact tracing.

In terms of reported positive cases, unless you receive a follow-up communication from the District that your child may be a close contact, you do not need to take further action at this time. We work closely with the Onondaga Department of Health to make a final determination and discuss quarantines in a timely manner.

We are extremely grateful to our committed families and staff who continue to show great flexibility and resilience as we work together to contain the spread of this virus. IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

Grade-Level Requirements for Health Exams and Screenings Families must comply with new grade-level requirements for health exams and screenings. Beginning July 1, 2018, all new students enrolling in the district for the first time—along with children entering pre-kindergarten, kindergarten, and grades 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, and 11 in the fall— will be required to have a health exam.

Other changes for students include vision screening for distance and near vision acuity as well as hearing screening within 6 months of admission to school and for students in pre-kindergarten, kindergarten and grades 1, 3, 5, 7 and 11. In addition, girls in grades 5 and 7 and boys in grade 9 will require scoliosis screenings.

We encourage families to not wait to schedule medical appointments. Please also take the time to review your child's immunization records with their pediatrician to ensure your child has the required vaccinations for their age and grade in school.

This will help ensure all children meet their health-care requirements before the start of the school year. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Lyncourt school nurse Lowery or your pediatrician. Annual physicals are also required for all students participating in any athletic program.

Medication in school

If it is necessary for a child to take or use medicine (prescription or over-the-counter) during school hours, the following rules apply:

• The parent or guardian must submit a signed request to the school nurse.

• The family physician must also submit a written request, detailing the frequency and dosage of the medication and the purpose for which it is being taken.

• All medicines must be delivered to the nurse by a parent or guardian.

• The medication will be kept in the nurse's office and will be administered by or under the supervision of the nurse, unless the student has an order from a physician to carry and self-administer medication (i.e., an inhaler).

• The medication must be in the prescription bottle or over the-counter container.

WHEN SHOULD I KEEP MY CHILD HOME FROM SCHOOL?

If your student or any member of your household has any of the following symptoms:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

This list does not include all possible <u>COVID-19 symptoms</u>. Children and adolescents with the virus that causes COVID-19 may experience any, all, or none of these symptoms.

PARENTS' RIGHT TO KNOW

Under Federal "No Child Left Behind" legislation, it is the right of the parent of any student attending Lyncourt School to request information regarding their child's classroom teacher(s) and paraprofessional staff assigned to teach their children. Minimum information parents may request includes:

- Whether the teacher has met State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction;
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria have been waived;
- The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree; and
- Whether the child is provided direct services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

The Lyncourt Union Free School District is pleased to inform parents of students that all classroom teachers have the requisite New York State certification for their employment. Our paraprofessional staff does not provide direct services to students. Questions regarding a teacher's specific baccalaureate or advanced degrees should be sent in writing to:

PARENT NOTIFICATION
